| Simple Crochet Carrot | Simple Crochet Peas in a Pod |
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| With color A, ch 15 (includes 3 chs as first DC). | With Color A, ch 25. |
| Round 1. 2 DC in 4th ch, DC in each of next 2 chs, HDC in each of next 4 chs, SC in each of next 4 chs, (SC, ch 3, SC) in last ch, continue working on opposite side of chain: SC in each of next 4 chs, HDC in each of next 4 chs, DC in each of next 2 chs, 4 DC in last, Sl St in top of first DC to join. Round 2. Ch 1, 2 SC in fist St, 2 SC in each of next 2 sts, SC in each of next 11 sts, (SC, ch 1, DC, ch 1, SC) in ch-3 space, SC in each of 11 sts, 2 SC in each of next 4 sts, Sl St in top of first SC to join. Fasten off. Leaves: Join Color B to the top of the carrot,*ch 12, SC in 2nd ch and in each of next 9 chs, Sl St in next ch, Sl St into same st where you joined Color B*, repeat from * to * 2 more times. Sl St in 2nd ch from hook and in next ch, SC in each on next 3 chs, HDC in each of next 3 chs, DC in each of next 4 chs, 2 DC in next ch, DC in each of next 4 chs, HDC in each of next 3 chs, SC in next ch Sl St in each of next 3 chs, turn. Row 2. Skip first St, Sl St in each of next 2 sts, SC in each of next 2 sts, HDC in each of next 15 sts, SC in each of next 2 sts, Sl St in next st. Fasten off. Pea With Color B, 9 SC in a magic ring, Sl St in top of first SC to join. Fasten off. From goldenlucycrafts.com |

Chain 5, join with Sl St.

Row 1. Chain 4 (counts as DC, ch1), (9 DC. Ch 1) into circle. Join with SI St into top of chain 3.

Row 2. Chain 4, DC in next ch1 space, ch1, (DC, ch 1, DC) in each ch 1 space from previous row, ch1. Join with Sl St into top of chain 3.

Row 3. Chain 3, DC in next ch1 space, ch1, (2 DC, ch1) in each ch1 space. Join with SI St in top of chain 3.

Row 4. Sl St in next DC and Ch1 space, chain 3 and DC in same space, (ch1 2DC) in each ch 1 space, ch1. Join with Sl St in top of chain 3.

Row 5. SI St to next ch1 space, (chain 3, DC, ch2, DC 2) in same space, *(ch1, DC) in next 2 ch1 spaces, ch1, (DC 2, ch2, DC2) in next ch1 space*, repeat from * to* 4 more times, *(ch1, DC) in next 2 ch1 spaces, ch1. Join with SI St in top of chain 3.

Row 6. SI St to next ch1 space, (chain 3, DC, ch2, DC 2) in same space, *(ch1, DC) in next 3 ch1 spaces, ch1, (DC 2, ch2, DC2) in next ch1 space*, repeat from * to* 4 more times, *(ch1, DC) in next 3 ch1 spaces, ch1. Join with SI St in top of chain 3.
